Dear Mr. Oliver:

The draft Recovery Plan for endangered Cook Inlet beluga whales is now available for public review. Section 4(f)(1) of the Endangered Species Act (ESA) requires the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) to develop and implement recovery plans for listed species. In October 2008, NMFS listed the Cook Inlet beluga whale as an endangered species. In March 2010, NMFS convened a Recovery Team to help draft a Recovery Plan. The Recovery Team was comprised of over 30 members organized in two advisory groups: a Science Panel and a Stakeholder Panel. In March 2013, the Recovery Team provided NMFS with the first draft of the Recovery Plan. This marked the completion of the team's work; therefore it disbanded and NMFS took responsibility for finalizing the draft Recovery Plan.

Today NMFS published a notice in the Federal Register (80 FR 27925) announcing the availability of the draft Recovery Plan for the Cook Inlet Beluga Whale for public review and comment. NMFS will consider all information received during the 60-day public comment period as we develop the final Recovery Plan. Procedures for commenting are detailed in the Federal Register notice.
